CURBSIDE RECYCLING INFORMATION

Paper and commingled material recycling pickup takes place every other week, except holiday weeks.

COMMINGLED MATERIAL

- **METAL** cans should only consist of food and pet food types. Labels may remain on and metal lids included.
- **GLASS** jars and bottles of all types and colors are acceptable. Labels may remain on and metal caps included. Plastic caps should not be included.
- **PLASTIC** bottles such as soda, juice, milk jugs and detergent containers that are coded with a "1" or "2". Plastic caps should not be included.
- **EMPTY AEROSOL CANS** only; spray nozzles and plastic caps should not be included.
- **CLEAN ALUMINUM FOIL & TRAYS**

All commingled items must be rinsed to free them of food particles and residue. All material above should be combined together at curbside in the container/box that will be emptied and left for reuse. Material in plastic bags will not be collected.

PAPER/CARDBOARD PULP

- **NEWSPAPER**, including inserts. May be bundled or placed in a container or box that can be emptied and left for reuse.
- **CORRUGATED CARDBOARD** must be "non wax" cardboard and free of excessive amounts of plastic adhesive tape. Staples need not be removed. It can either be broken up and placed inside a container/cardboard box or used to contain newspaper.
- **BROWN GROCERY BAGS** should be folded and placed inside another kraft bag, or bag may be used to contain newspaper and junk mail
- **MAGAZINES** consisting of colored, glossy periodicals and catalogs.
- **JUNK MAIL** consisting of envelopes, sweepstakes forms and office papers.
- **BULK METAL** such as stoves, ranges, barbecue grills etc., placed at curbside. In order to facilitate collection, call 993-1576 on the Wednesday prior to Tuesday pickup.
- **TIRES** rims **must** be removed from tires.

What We're Doing:

We're going to pick up recyclables every week. During a non-holiday week collections will alternate: One week paper, the other week commingled containers. During holiday weeks, both paper and commingled containers will be collected on separate days.

This will improve efficiency of the collection process by having all personnel assigned to do the same work. All collections can be performed using fully-enclosed compaction vehicles, eliminating roadside spillage of empty plastic containers.

YARDWASTE branches/brush (cut to 4 foot lengths and tied), leaves, grass clippings, etc., placed in **BIODEGRADABLE PAPER BAGS**

HOUSEHOLD CHEMICAL CLEANUP DAYS

Every year Westchester County sponsors **Household Chemical Clean-up Days** so that residents may dispose of household chemicals that should not be discarded with the regular garbage. There is no fee; however, pre-registration is required for 60 pounds of solid material or 25 gallons or more of liquids. DISPOSE OF HOME MEDICAL WASTE THE RIGHT WAY!

Residents may place needles, syringes, lancets and other sharp objects in a puncture-proof, hard plastic container that you can't see through (such as a detergent bottle), or use a metal container with the lid reinforced with tape (such as a coffee can). Lids that screw on tightly are the best. The sealed container should be placed with the trash and not with recycling material. Improperly discarded medical waste can injure trash haulers, contaminate and jeopardize recycling programs and be re-used and shared by drug abusers, possibly spreading disease.
